



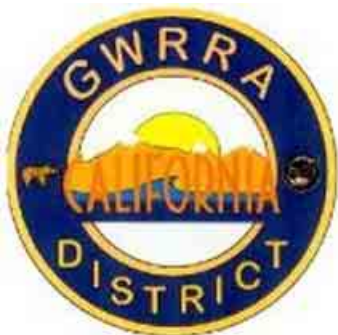

California News & Views

The District Rally for 2002 is completed and I believe everyone that attended had FUN with their FRIENDS. Next year's Rally will be in Visalia at a Holiday Inn that has recently completed a 6 million dollar renovation. So mark August 29, 30 and 31st on your GWRRA calendars for 2003.

If you haven't noticed we have a new Chapter in California. This Chapter is in the Sacramento area, which is the Capitol City for California. Therefore the Letter Designation of "C" was appropriate. The Chapter designation is CA-C.

Since the requirement of using CA-1 and CA-2 to distinguish between two different Districts ended about 1994 our newest Chapter is not CA-1C nor CA-2C **it is CA-C**. This started me thinking why don't we set up a procedure to allow chapters with exclusive use of their letter to eliminate the 1 or 2 preceding their Letter Designation. There are only 6 chapters that share a letter. The remaining 12 chapters have exclusive use of their letter. They should be allowed to drop their 1 or 2 so they would be referred to by their letter and not need to use the number 1 or 2 when referring to their designation.

A procedure has been established with the approval of National and Region F. Under this procedure the request is to be made by letter signed by the Chapter Director addressed to the California District Director. The District Director will then approve the request and notify the Region F Director and the Home Office to complete the change of that Chapter's Designation. This will result in updating the Chapter's listing in Wing World.

This elimination of the number **will not** require the immediate change on Chapter Vests or any other item owned by the Chapter or its members. These changes on Chapter Vests or other item would be made at the discretion of the individual members them selves.

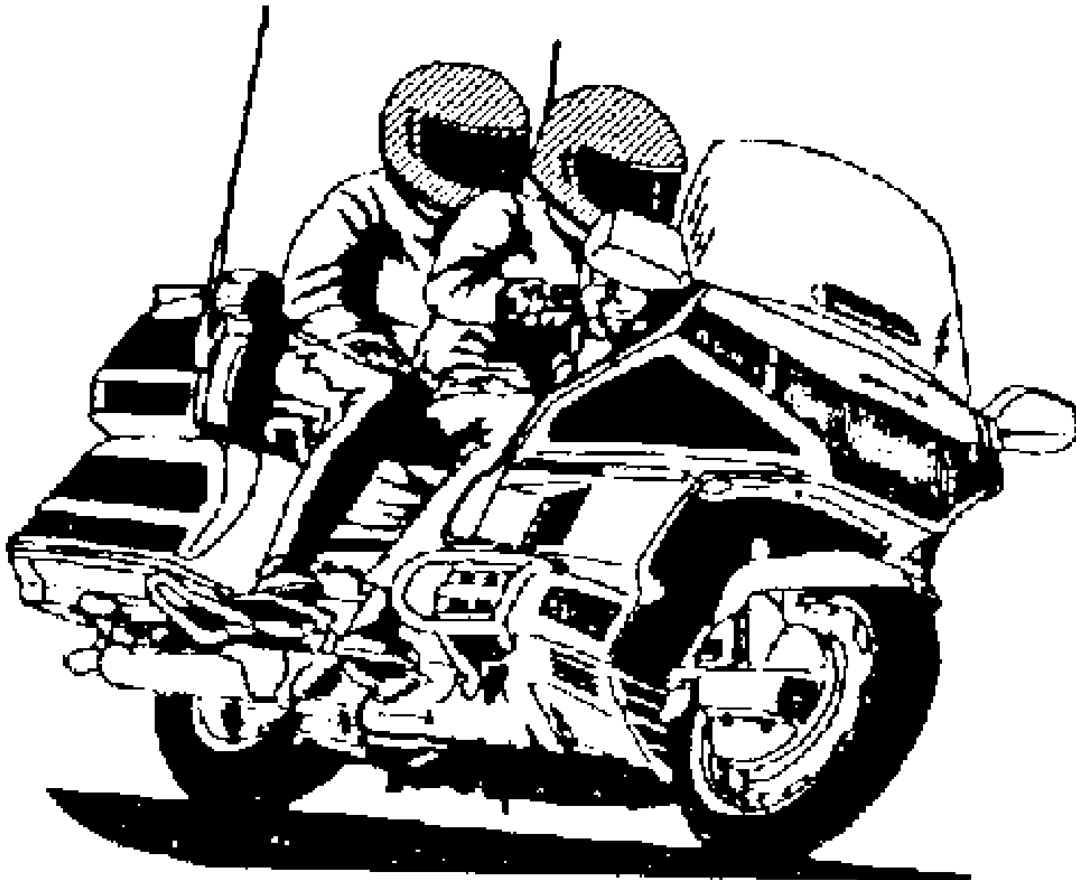

INTERNATIONAL MOTORCYCLE ASSOCIATION ANNOUNCES 25th ANNIVERSARY CONVENTION LOCATION

The Gold Wing Road Riders Association (GWRRA) is excited to return to Madison, Wisconsin for its 25th Anniversary Wing Ding! Wing Ding XXV will be held at the Alliant Energy Center (formerly Dane County Memorial Coliseum) July 1 - July 4, 2003.

Next July's Wing Ding marks the fourth return of GWRRA's annual convention to Madison, the most to any city since the event's inception in 1979. Wing Ding was previously held in Madison in 1989, 1992 and 1996.

In addition to offering park-like, on-site and close-in RV sites, the Alliant Energy Center boasts more than 160,000 square feet of vendor space and an 8,000 seat arena. Remembering past successful Wing Dings, Madison's hospitality industry is already preparing to welcome the predicted 13,000 touring motorcyclists to their properties with special rates (see list of preferred hotels at <http://www.gwrro.org/wingding>), and will have plenty of hearty Wisconsin-fresh cuisine.

As always, GWRRA will offer the world's largest Gold Wing/Valkyrie trade show with hundreds of vendors. Along with educational seminars, a talent show, motorcycle drill team demonstrations, entertainment and many family-oriented activities, GWRRA is planning extra surprises to celebrate the uniqueness of this year's event.

The theme of Wing Ding XXV is "Family Reunion." As it is in many families, many GWRRA members see each other only once a year at Wing Ding. Delegates come to Wing Ding from every one of the 50 United States and 13 Canadian Provinces, as well as from at least 13 overseas countries.

The Gold Wing Road Riders Association is the world's largest association of Gold Wing/Valkyrie enthusiasts with 80,000 members in 50 countries. GWRRA, founded in 1977, is a non-political, non-religious social organization dedicated to the concept of providing a full-benefits association of *Friends for Fun, Safety and Knowledge* while working to improve the image of family-oriented, long-distance touring motorcycling everywhere.

Re: Certified Riding Instructors needed!
Date: September 15, 2002

In past months, Rider Education has focused on training Seminar Instructors. Rider Education also provides on-bike instruction via Certified Riding Instructors teaching the GWRRA Trike Course, Trailing Course, and the up-coming Advanced Riding Course. Region F is in desperate need of these courses and instructors to teach them. The minimum requirement for a GWRRA Riding Instructor is being a current Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) instructor. Please announce to your Chapters and Districts that we need the assistance of all interested MSF Instructors. Those interested in teaching the GWRRA Riding Courses should apply using the attached form. Once these MSF Instructors have applied, a training course will be scheduled to certify these instructors on the GWRRA Riding Courses.

The basic hierarchy of the GWRRA Riding course instruction is that Instructors teach Members, Master Instructors certify Riding Instructors, and National Master Trainers train Master Instructors. In spite of having many MSF instructors within Region F, we have only three certified Riding Instructors and no current Master Instructors! We can do better.

Region F Rider Education is searching for MSF Instructors interested in becoming Certified Riding Instructors as well those who have experience teaching the GWRRA Trike and Trailing Courses that would like to become Master Instructors. Until we develop a cadre of Instructors and Master Instructors of our own, Region F will not be self-sufficient nor be able to support our membership. With the increasing numbers of Trikes in GWRRA, it is critical that we develop a support structure within Rider Education for this growing segment.

The Riding Instructor certification program has been rebuilt by National in the past year. From a logistical standpoint, there may be former instructors in your District/Chapter who were previously certified on older versions of the Trike Course and are teaching incorrect or out-dated course curricula. To resolve this, all past Riding Instructors are required to re-apply so that they receive updated instructional materials. With recent changes to the Trike and Trailing course as well as the upcoming Advanced Riding Course, National has dictated that all past Riding Instructor certification cards expire in December 2002. With the exception of Charlie Thayer (AZ), Jim Davis (NM), and Virgil Kipers (CO), anyone else who has taught the Trike or Trailer course in the past or has an old GWRRA Riding Instructor card needs to update their status by completing the attached Riding Instructor application.

We have a commitment from National Rider Education to provide a Master Trainer to certify new Master Riding Instructor and Riding Instructor applicants. Now all we need is applicants! Without Certified Instructors and Master Instructors, we will not be able to provide the Trike or Trailing courses at the Region level in the Southwest. Please spread the word to your Districts and Chapters. The location of future Instructor and Master instructor training courses will be determined by which Districts promote this program and drum up the support. As always, feel free to contact Dori and me with and further concerns or questions on this or any other issue. We are here to help.

GWRRA Riding Instructor Program Frequently Asked Questions

Q. Why must I submit a new Instructor Application? I already did that once.

A. Submitting the new application updates the administrative database of instructors:

1. So that the National staff may be more accurate in its communication with instructors (e-mails and addresses, many of which were outdated);
2. To ensure that our members are receiving the best quality instruction through certification standards and updates;
3. To provide documentation required by the insurance underwriters and to satisfy the professional Motorcycle Safety Administrator requirements being levied in many states*;
4. To separate Riding Instructor data from Seminar Instructor data thus avoiding much previous confusion as to who was certified to do what.

** Note 1. Some instructors in the past have operated outside of the GWRRA system and standards, thus negating any insurance coverage provided by GWRRA. Had there been an incident during these courses, the instructor, and possibly some students in the class, could have been held personally liable for injuries or damages, regardless of any waivers, releases etc. signed by the students. By working with the insurance underwriters, and the Motorcycle Safety Administrators in many states, we have created a system and standards that will protect our members and instructors, and help ensure that GWRRA Riding Courses will not be legally excluded in some states.*

Q. Who is eligible to become a GWRRA Rider Course Instructor?

A. All currently certified MSF, ESC or CSC instructors may become a GWRRA Rider Course Instructor simply by submitting a Rider Course Instructor application to the appropriate National Officer, currently, Bob Berry. Once the application is processed, the applicant will receive his/her new instructor card. At that point the instructor is certified by GWRRA to teach only those courses in which he/she is certified to teach through the MSF, ESC or CSC.

Q. What if a new GW Instructor wants to teach the GWRRA TC (Trailing Course) and/or the TRC (Trike Course)?

A. That new instructor must meet the qualifications for certification and participate in the appropriate Instructor Preparation (IP) course for each GWRRA Rider Course in which he/she wishes to be certified. IP courses are offered through the Region Educators and conducted by GWRRA Master Rider Instructors.

In addition to being a currently certified MSF, CSC, or ESC, instructor, the candidate must pass the Rider Course Instructor candidates written, classroom, and field tests, have no more than 4 points on his/her motorcycle license, have no DUI convictions for the past five years, be current in Level 3 or above in the REP, and demonstrate safe riding habits by always wearing proper riding gear as defined in the REP.

Q. What if I have previously been certified to teach the TC and/or the TRC?

A. On the new Rider Course Instructor application there is a section for you to fill in indicating the courses in which you have been certified, the date of your certification, and the Master Rider Instructor who certified you. Those certifications will be included in the updated database and be transferred to your new instructor card. There is no need to participate in an additional IP for those Rider courses in which you have been previously certified.

Q. When will the old instructor cards and certifications expire?

A. On December 31, 2002, all previously administered Rider Instructor Cards and certification information will expire. Any Riding Instructor who has not submitted a new application by that date will no longer be eligible to teach any riding course associated with GWRRA.

Q. How will I know if my current application is the correct one?

A. If you have submitted a Rider Course Instructor Application to Bob Berry during the 2002 calendar year, your application is correct. Those instructors who have not submitted a new application by October 15, 2002, will be notified that they must submit a new application by year-end or forfeit their privilege of being a certified GWRRA Riding Instructor.

Q. I never had any requirements to maintain my certification before. Why now?

A. There have always been requirements to maintain certification. We have added some requirements to satisfy those issues in note 1. If we wish to remain viable as a Rider Training organization, we must maintain a level of professionalism commensurate with State Motorcycle Administrator standards. Failure to do so puts the entire GWRRA program in jeopardy.

Second, and probably more important, is to ensure a positive experience for our members. An instructor who fails to meet the maintenance requirements is, at best, rusty and, therefore, unable to deliver a quality program. Further, an instructor who does not demonstrate a commitment to the Rider Education Program, fails to be the role model we encourage our instructors to be.

Q. I know that the TRC is Trike and that TC is Trailering. What is ARC?

A. The ARC is the Advanced Rider Course currently being developed. Do not confuse the ARC with the MSF ERC. They are two different courses. Also, there is no such course as the Trike ERC. The Trike Course is simply the TRC or Trike Rider Course.

Q. With all of the changes and improvements in the classroom and range materials, how will I know if I have the right version?

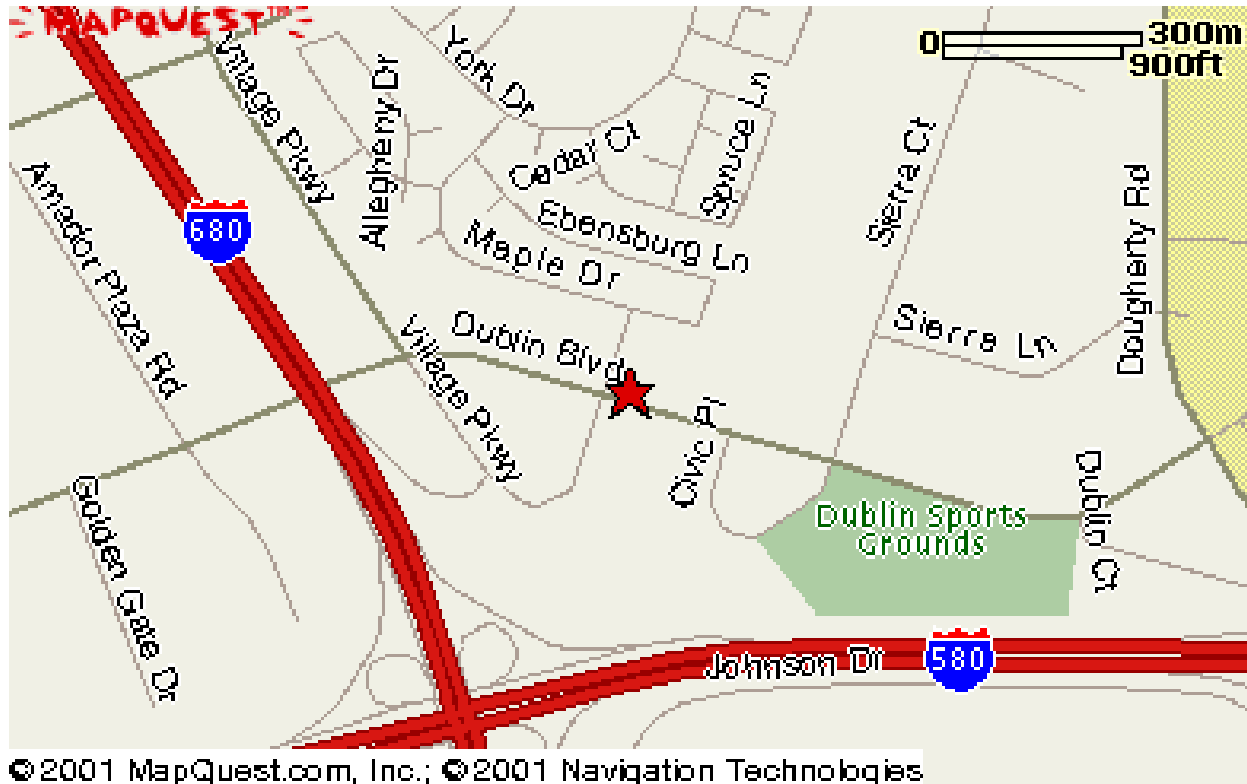
A. All of the Riding Instructor materials will have a version number, much like computer software. You will be notified of all changes as they occur. That is another reason to keep your contact information (e-mail and/or address) up to date. We would like to have a spot on the GWRRA Web site that indicates the version number in use. Hold that thought. We don't have it yet.

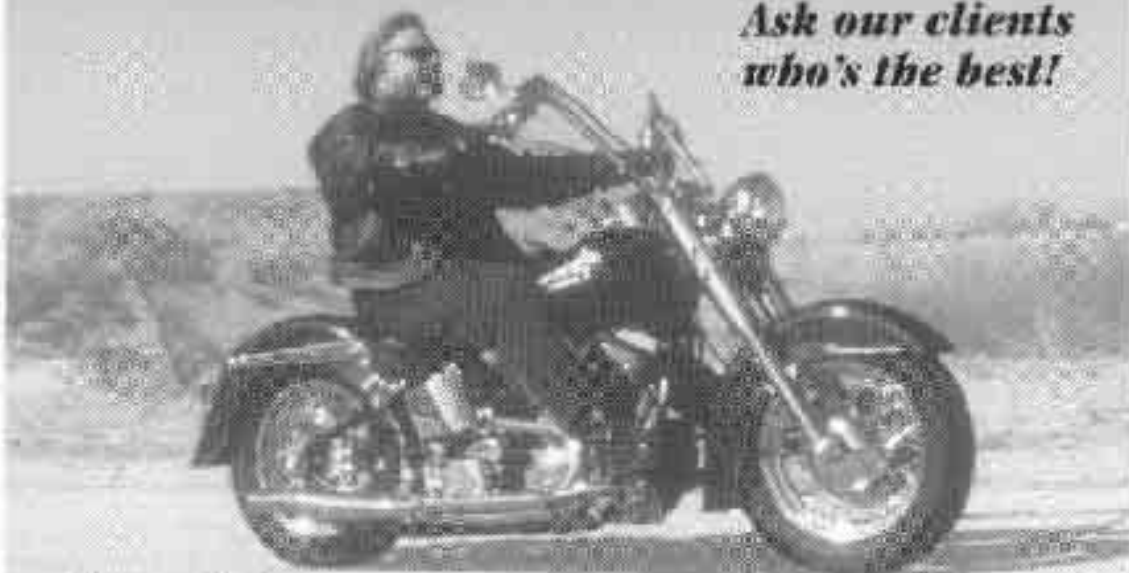
