## Questions about motorcycle laws

Note: These questions pertain to California law and laws as outlined within the California Vehicle Code.

**Do I need a Motorcycle endorsement (Class M) to ride a Trike, or Motorcycle with side car?** No, you don't. California requires that you have a Class M1 or Class M instruction permit, to operate a "TWO" wheeled motorcycle. The easiest way to remember this is, if you have to balance your vehicle, you need a Class "M" endorsement.

**What happens if my bike alarm is triggered and I'm not around to stop it?** According to Section 22651.5 (a), if a Peace Officer arrives on scene and cannot locate the owner within 20 minutes of their arrival time, the vehicle can be towed.

**Can I ride my motorcycle in the bike lane?** Nope. According to Section 21209 you can't drive a motor vehicle in a bike lane except 1) to park where parking is permitted, 2) to enter or leave the roadway, or 3) to prepare for a turn within a distance of 200 feet from the intersection.

**Can I listen to music through headphones while I ride?** Technically, no. As long as you're not covering *both* ears with a headset, you're okay. But as of Jan 1, 2004 subsection (d) of Section 27400 says you can wear ear protection, if it does not interfere with your ability to hear a siren or horn. I guess the burden of proof is with the state.

**Is lane-splitting legal?** California vehicle code sections, 21750 thru 21755 deal with passing other traffic. Peace Officers are given latitude or discretion in regards enforcing passing laws. As long as there is sufficient clearance and you do not interfere with the operation of any other vehicles or traffic, it is technically permissible. I strongly discourage passing moving traffic, as it weakens your court defense and increases your chance for a collision.

**Can I lane-split to the front of a metered onramp?** The same rules apply to the passing laws, except when it is posted, "No lane sharing". Then you are disobeying the sign, a moving violation with a fine exceeding \$136.00.

**What are my license requirements if I'm from another state or country?** You must obtain a California drivers license within 10 days of establishing residency within the state. Review Ca Vehicle Code section 516 to obtain the definition of a Resident.

**What color lights can I have on my bike?** Section 25950 limits the colors of the lights and reflectors on vehicles to white, yellow, amber and red. Exceptions are made for certain vehicles such as law enforcement vehicles. Green is also acceptable on running boards and door-mounted courtesy lamps (if you have these on your bike, you might just own the biggest bike ever made).

**Can I put flashing lights on my bike?** In general, flashing lights are not allowed unless you're indicating a turn or lane change, warning of a traffic hazard, or driving a vehicle with a special purpose. Here are a few exceptions: Section 25251.5 (a) and (b) allow a flashing amber light to be used to indicate deceleration. Subdivision (c) allows any stop lamp to be equipped so as to flash not more than four times within the first four seconds after applying the brakes. Section 25251.2 allows for modulating headlamps. (See Section 25251 of the California Vehicle Code for complete details on flashing lights.)

**Can I park in a location where there is only one stall line to the left or right of me?** Most parking lots are private property and are not subject to the vehicle code but there are a few exceptions, such as Disabled parking stalls. This is usually the hashed marked area next to the Disabled stall, to allow the unloading of wheelchairs etc. I often see motorcycle parked in these areas and the fine ranges from \$275 to \$350 dollars. Some cities have local ordinances, so check with your local authorities. Remember, a motorcycle is a motor vehicle. If you are in doubt, parking it in a marked stall, just as you would your car.

**Can I park on the sidewalk?** Motorcycles are considered vehicles by the California Vehicle Code and are subject to the same rules and regulations of any car, so motorcycles cannot park on any sidewalk that is public land. In shopping centers, most cities have local ordinances prohibiting parking on the sidewalk.

**Can I share a metered parking spot?** As for parking at a meter, a motorcycle's rear tire or fender must touch the curb; and yes, you must pay for the parking space you are using. If you share the space with another car, you could be subject to citation." Technically, it sounds like two bikes sharing a metered stall would be subject to citation if all vehicles are treated equally. I guess this is something that has not been giving consideration by the legislature, as motorcycles take up less space.

**Can my pet be a passenger?** There is a loop hole in this one. CVC section 23117 says, you cannot carry a pet in the rear of a motor vehicle, in a space designed to carry a load. In any event, make sure the pet is either tethered or secured in a cage or compartment. Many Peace Officers are unaware of this and misinterpret this section.

**What's the youngest passenger I can carry?** There is no age defined but every passenger on a motorcycle must keep his or her feet on the footrests. This would indicate that a child would at least require legs long enough to reach the pegs (Section 27800). What if an owner has raised the foot pegs so a child can reach them? Well, there's always Section 21712 (b) which states that "No person shall ride on any vehicle or upon any portion thereof not designed or intended for the use of passengers." My advice is if they cannot reach the stock foot pegs, they may not be mature enough to ride safely on a motorcycle. Buy a side car if you insist on transporting small children on a motorcycle.

**Can I smoke while I ride?** Section 23111 points out that no person in any vehicle may throw or discharge any lighted or non-lit cigarette, cigar, match, or any flaming or glowing substance. The mere fact that the ash is coming off a cigarette and freely drifting into the great wide open could get the smoker a ticket. Why would you want to smoke and ride? It requires you to take a hand off of your controls and take away a reason to stop for a break.

**Can I wear tinted visors after sunset?** There are those occasions when the sun has set and we're still on the road wearing a tinted visor. Section 26708 addresses shading and tinting devices on *windows*, but there is nothing prohibiting the wearing of tinted visors after sunset. Same thing goes for sunglasses. Do you wear sunglasses at night?

**Can the highway patrol write me a ticket on city streets and can city cops write me a ticket on the freeway?** Yep, in California all State and City cops have California Peace Officer status. There are no jurisdictional lines, except for where you will appear in court.

**Is doing a wheelie illegal?** Doing a wheelie is not safe. In the opinion of most Peace Officers, a wheelie is an Exhibition of speed. Refer to section CVC section 23109. Also, there are other sections such as an Unsafe start, section 22106 and Reckless driving, 23103(c), which is also enforceable in private property parking facilities.

*“Beware of the Skid Demon”*

***Taken from a 1962 Honda Motor Cycle Instruction Book. Translated by Honda for the American Motorcycle Rider:***

1. At the rise of the hand by Policeman, stop rapidly. Do not pass him by or otherwise disrespect him.
2. When a passenger of the foot, hooves in sight, tootel the horn trumpet melodiously at first. If he still obstacles your passage, tootel him with vigor and express by word of mouth, warning Hi, Hi.
3. Beware of the wandering horse that he shall not take fright as you pass him. Do not explode the exhaust box at him. Go soothingly by.
4. Give big space to the festive dog that makes sport in roadway. Avoid entanglement of dog with wheel spokes.
5. Go soothingly on the grease mud, as there lurks the skid demon. Press the brake foot as you roll around the corners, and save the collapse and tie up.

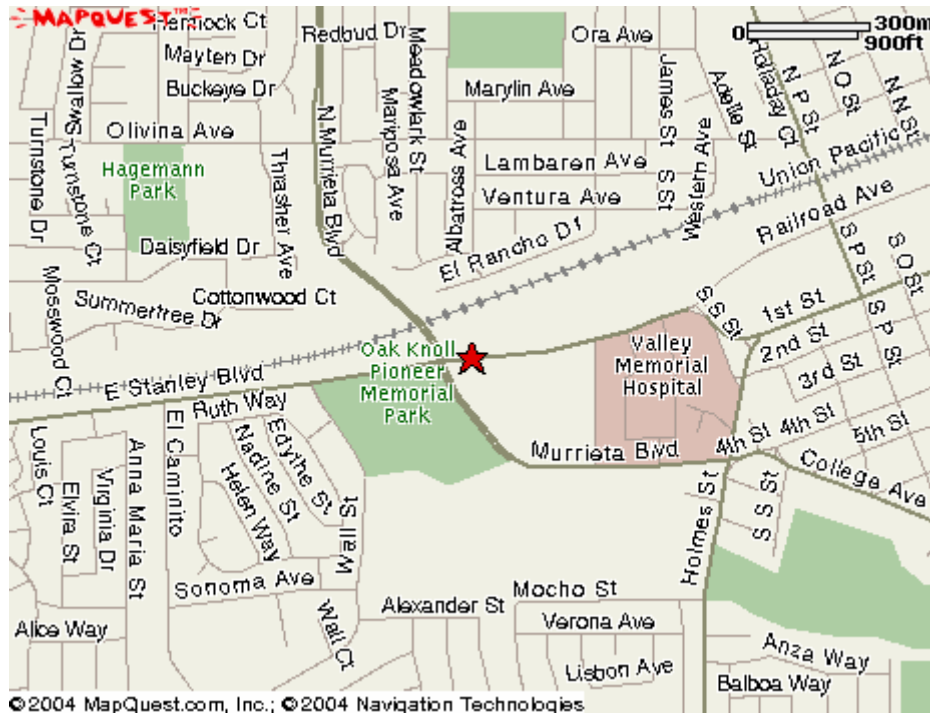
