I figured that if anything, it would be a great learning experience and I'd likely realize some improvements in some of my motorcycling skills and also my knowledge about safety on a motorcycle. I have to say it's been an interesting and worthwhile experience and I have enjoyed all of my classes. Well, except for the classes running late each Friday night and then running long days Saturday and Sunday. Fortunately, my perseverance paid off and late today I completed my tests and work and I was awarded a MSF RiderCoach designation.

The MSF programs are all about promoting life-long learning and development for motorcyclists, safety and safety research, public awareness campaigns, and the provision of technical assistance to state training and licensing programs. I also now have some great contacts for setting up some of the Experienced Riders classes that I have wanted to have available for members in our chapter. For those who are interested, we can setup a class. Additionally, if you are a HRCA member Honda will reimburse the cost of the Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) rider-training courses for up to \$75 each year. So stay tuned and I'll have more information on this class.

Lastly, we will be having another 2006 planning meeting at my home on February 4th at 6:30 pm for ideas and input on what members want to do as a chapter during the year. This will be a potluck dinner and if you are interested in coming and haven't talked to me yet, let me know so I can get you on the list.

In case you were wondering where your Chapter staff was a few weeks ago, we had our yearly District staff meeting in Bakersfield on January 7th. This is our only chance to meet in person other than District Rally and 130 people from all over the state were in attendance. If I do say so myself, it went very well. Nobody fell asleep and each Chapter's staff had a chance to meet and greet other Chapter's and District staff. We have filled some vacancies in our staff, but there are a few that remain open, so if you are interested in helping out, let me know. Like each Chapter, the District has no restrictions on what staff we can have, so if you see a need for a new position, bring that up to me.

The ride calendar for the year has been finalized and is available now on the District Web site. Don't forget to mark your calendar ahead of time for the overnights and especially for District Rally. Speaking of this year, the 2006 Gold Wings have some VERY interesting added features. The most significant accessory is the first Air Bag available on a commercially produced motorcycle. You might think this is a joke, but there is a video going around that shows the crash test results and they are quite impressive. The test WITHOUT air bag shows a Gold Wing hitting a car broad side and the rider flies straight through the wind shield and into and over the car. The crash would have been fatal to the rider. The test WITH air bag shows the rider being restrained by the air bag and simply tipping over with the bike. The rider would have sustained almost no injuries. Another nice feature is the availability of a built in GPS system. The new wings are bound to attract more sales than ever, so don't be surprised if people you never thought would trade in their 1500s make the switch.

This will be our third and final year as your District Directors and Rick and I are looking forward to another fun and exciting year. Since we have already arranged the rally this year in Santa Clara, we are now looking for a 2007 location. We are hoping to find something coastal, but it can be a problem. If anybody knows of a facility that can handle a group our size, please let us know. Until we meet again: Ride safe, live each day to its fullest and don't look back.

Some attractions in the Elko area are: Northeastern Nevada Museum, California Trail, Newmont Mining Company tours, Western Folk Life Center, 35 restaurants, Elko Junction Shopping Center and East End Mall, Wal-Mart, as well as downtown shopping.

There are several scenic rides available within a 100-mile radius from Elko. They include Owyhee, NV, Lamoille Canyon, Harrison Pass, Angel Lake, Metropolis, NV, Tuscarora, NV, and I-80 east to Wells, NV and then U.S. Hwy 93 north from Wells, NV toward Twin Falls, ID. These are more than enough to keep you busy during the three-day celebration.

Remember, this is your Region. This rally is for you, the member, and it will only be successful if you are there. This is a combined Nevada District Rally and Region “F” Rally. Come see what changes we have made—we think you will be happy with them. We made these improvements because you asked for a different agenda. We need your support to make this rally a success.

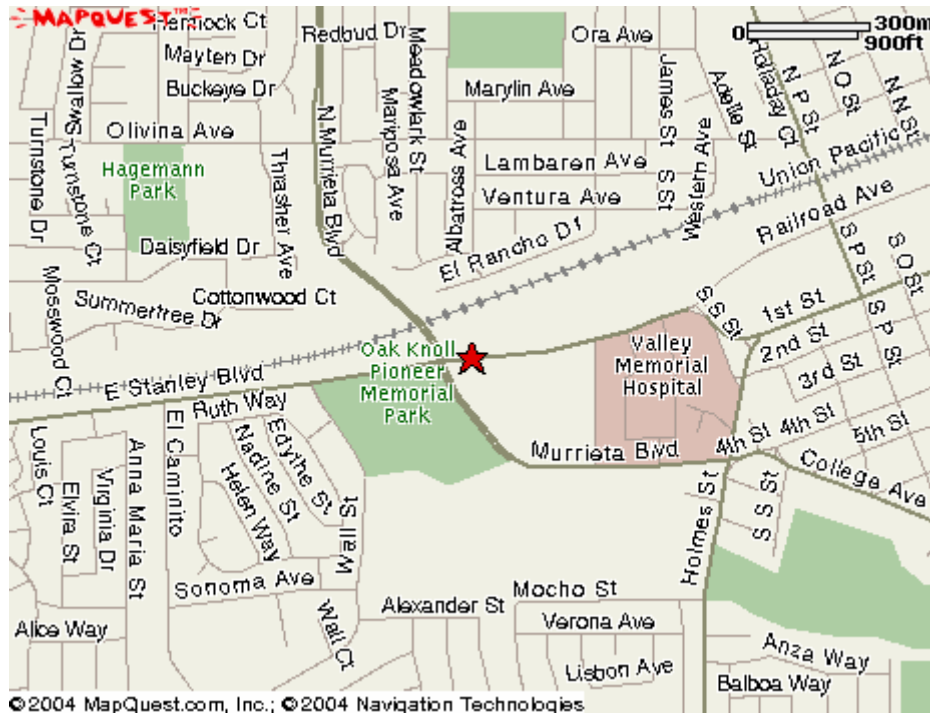
