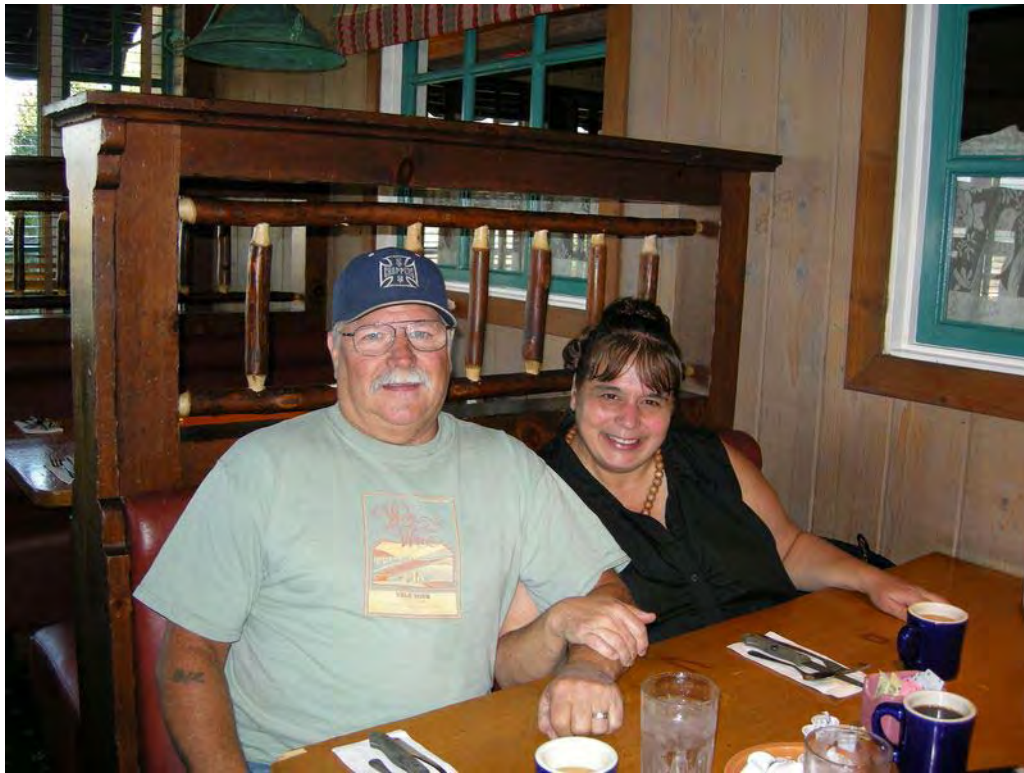

California District Golden State Gems

Welcome to autumn! As the weather starts to cool off it's time to dust off your electrics, find your rain suits and NOT winterize your California Gold Wing! Isn't this great? What a great place to live where we can ride all year. Remember, that although we are a riding organization, when it gets really cold or wet, we can still socialize by meeting each other and traveling by car, so keep your activity calendars full and let's

have fun together!

As we face the changing of the seasons, some chapters will be changing leadership. Change is a word that many of us don't like. It means getting used to a new speaker at our chapter meetings, a new dynamic with *their* new staff members, and a different attitude in our chapter. All of this can be great, fun and exciting, but we all have to keep a few things in mind. So we want to impart to you a bit of Horizon training, organizational training and some good ol' common sense.

Let's start with some of the Horizon's training and how GWRRA looks at the new leadership. Only one person steps into the position whether it is CD (Chapter Director), ACD (Assistant Chapter Director) or CE (Chapter Educator). These are the only Officers in your chapter! Usually the one who steps up has a partner be it a spouse or significant other, GWRRA looks at both of them as a unit when it comes to the actual workings of the position. Each Officer must take a knowledge exam; sign a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) which outlines their responsibilities and then a Confidentiality of Member Information. With these items and a Change of Officer form, they forward this onto the District Director (that's me, JR is my spouse and sidekick) and I process that paperwork. With the change of leadership, the chapter treasurer must also prepare a financial statement to be turned in along with the required paperwork. Once all of this is received, I schedule an installation date and send the paperwork off to our Region Director (Tom Jefferies, as a Pro Tem Director) and he will forward that to National. With the process successfully accomplished, WingWorld magazine reflects the correct Chapter Directors in the back of the magazine. Then JR and I come out to the chapter, or one of our Assistant District Directors on our behalf, and we present the Officer patches (that's the blue crested patches) to the Officer couples along with the GWRRA "wings" (gold eagle for CD, silver for ACD both with white inserts and the same with red inserts for the Educators) and an oath of office which is administered and signed. Now that new staff is official.

So let's talk some organization. The Chapter Director chooses their assistants, with our approval, recommends the Educator to the District Educator for approval and then chooses their staff. The one staff member that can not be related to the Officers is the treasurer. This is an independent chapter member, with some knowledge of running a checkbook and balancing bank statements. They do not have to be professional bookkeepers, accountants or CPA's. It is this persons responsibility at the monthly business/staff meeting, to give a financial report to include the past months balance, the current balance and be able to explain any expenditures of the chapter. This report should not be given at a chapter meeting! It is the decision of the CD, usually with consensus of their staff to spend money. Acceptable expenses are newsletters, website hosting, poker run, reimbursement for required attendance at the annual Officer's Meeting held in January (this would be the cost of lunch and if the chapter is financially able some or full reimbursement for lodging and gas) and then the fun stuff like taking the chapter for ice cream or even paying for a dinner. The chapter treasury is for the use of the chapter under direction from the CD, so other expenditures are possible. Usually the CD and ACD communicate on expenditures but a decision can be made by the CD alone. The CD answers to the staff at the monthly business meeting. This meeting is usually held a week before the chapter meeting so the agenda for the chapter meeting can be set and the activities discussed.

What is the proper size of a staff? My answer is everyone should be on staff. That's not usually possible, but if you hear a good idea then voluntold that individual or group and put them on staff in charge of that idea. The larger the staff, the

larger the core group of a chapter. As leaders, you are responsible for increasing your core group by inviting them to join in one member at a time. The CD should not try to do everything in the chapter. As a leader, they should greet new members or visitors and welcome existing members at the chapter meeting or any gathering of the chapter. You should be listening to your members and if you are trying to do everything you can't be present to hear, greet, or interact with your chapter. Delegating to your ACD is great training for them to help educate them on the requirements and workings of GWRRA and your chapter.

This brings us to good ol' common sense. Members, thank your CD for stepping up and taking on the leadership of your chapter. You may not agree with them all the time, but they were willing to take on the responsibility for carrying out the motto for GWRRA, "Friends for fun, safety and knowledge". They helped organize, through their efforts and those of their staff, the activities that you have enjoyed. It's fun being the CD, it's also hard work, so pat them on the back, give them a hug and say thank you. Former CD's this is your chance to shine for your chapter, supporting the new leadership, staying off criticism and offering wisdom, as only you have "been there done that". With the incoming Officer's and staff, give them a chance to settle in to their routine. Don't be critical and say, "we didn't use to do it that way", be willing to try new ideas. Change is good, seek the positive, ask to help out, be a part of your chapter's new success and fun. If you are voluntold, step up and take it on, it's new ideas and new members that keep chapter life exciting. Listen when your CD expresses their goals for the coming year and ask yourself, how can I help? From buying 50/25/25 tickets to supporting the chapter store or your own poker run or getting really bold and leading or planning a ride, all of this will help your chapter and I can promise you this, you'll actually get more out of it than your chapter members will because you always get back ten-fold what you put in!

So I guess this is really Chapter Leadership 101, the question is...will you pass the final exam a year from now? How do you pass? By getting involved, by letting that GWRRA "train" *hit you* and letting it enrich your life. Most importantly, remember to thank those in leadership for making your GWRRA membership just a little more special because they stepped up!

Thank you CD's, ACD's, CE's and ACE's and all your fabulous staff members for making California chapters a fun experience, we appreciate you! Thank you outstanding Assistant District Directors, District Educators and Assistants and our fantastic staff, **YOU ARE AWESOME!!!** All aboard the California GWRRA Train!

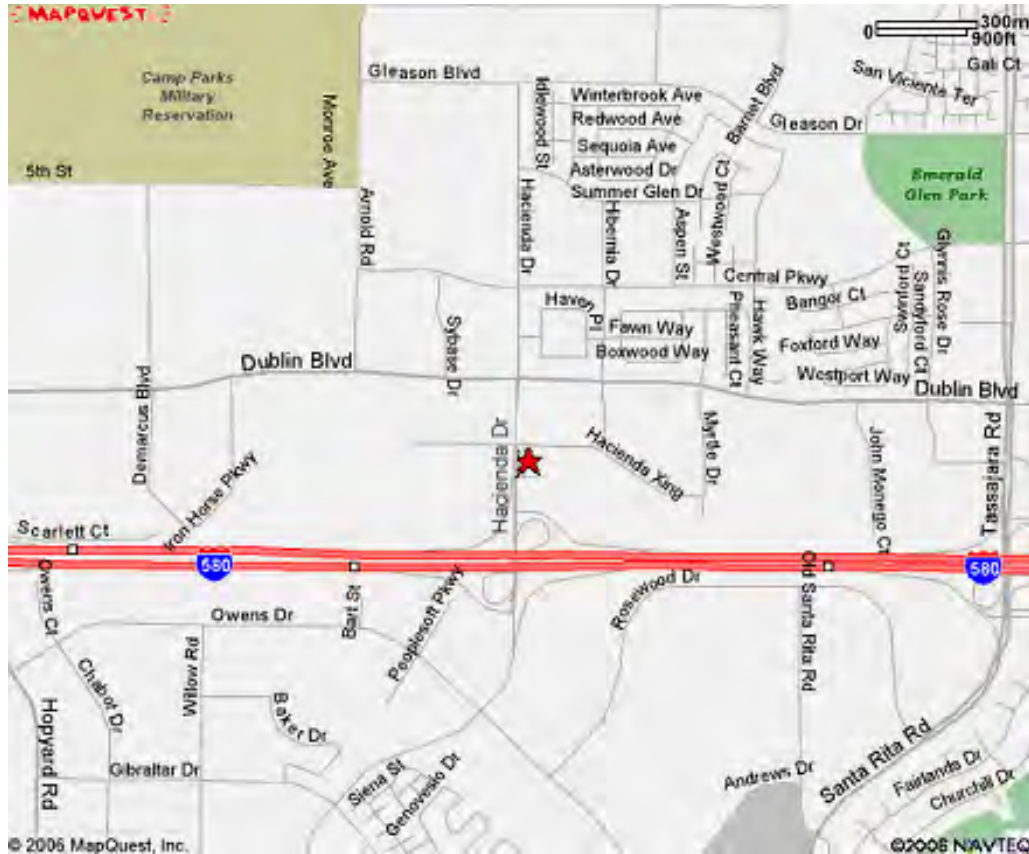
