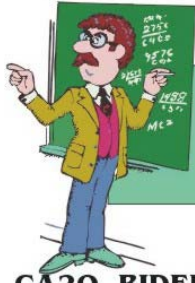

Educators Message



CA2Q RIDER EDUCATION

Helmet Cleaning – The Right Way.

- 1) When was the last time you cleaned your helmet - Not the outside, but the inside, The soft inner liner that cuddles up against your sweaty greasy noggin every minute your aboard your bike?
- 2) Are your liners removable?
- 3) Do you have communication electronics installed in the helmet?
- 4) If you can, remove the liner from the helmet, if not then the entire helmet will need to be immersed in the cleaner. You 'may' need to remove the communication electronics if the liners are not removable.
- 5) If you do need to completely immerse your helmet in order to clean it check first with the manufacturer, as not all of them use adhesives that are impervious to water.
- 6) Arai recommends the use of Shampoo and warm water - Shoei recommends using Woolite.
- 7) Use a soft non-abrasive towel or rag to remove the dirt, oils, and bugs from the liner.
- 8) Use a Q-tip to get at and clean the tight pesky places where the bugs may have spent their last moment.
- 9) Rinse thoroughly and allow to dry - drying can take several days. Do Not use heat.
- 10) Re-install and test any parts removed from the helmet before use.

Here's another one -->

Use vertical strokes when washing windows outside and horizontal for inside windows. This way you can tell which side has the streaks. Straight vinegar will get outside windows really clean. Don't wash windows on a sunny day. They will dry too quickly and will probably streak.

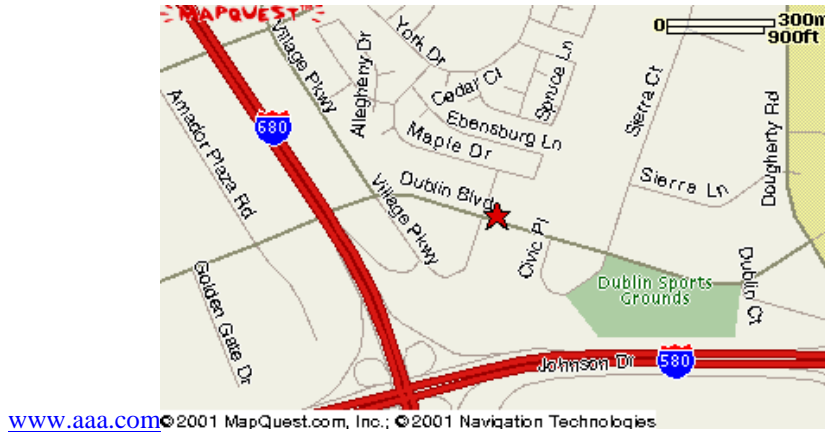
